


CEMENT, HARDWARE, STONE AND SAND

DELIVERIES TO RETAILERS




Hardware comes from Chandigarh and Mohali. Cement comes from Barmana and Darla Ghat. Sand and stone comes from Bilaspur.




Building materials are delivered to distributors and traders in Shimla. From distributors and traders the goods are then delivered to city based retailers and nearby town markets






Building materials delivered to nearby markets from distributors and traders in Shimla













